

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

## Guru Pūrņimā Celebrations







*Guru Pūrṇimā*, a sacred day for all spiritual seekers, fell on July 31<sup>st</sup> this year. It is a day to remember and express gratitude towards one's *Guru*, or teacher, for the blessings and knowledge one has received. *Guru-Pādukā Pūjā* was performed by Rajasekar Vaidyanathan.

Śrī Guru-stotram, Guru-śiṣya-paramparā Stotram and Śrī Guru-Pādukā-Stotram were chanted. The evening concluded with singing of bhajans and arati led by the Chinmaya Dhvani team, followed by prasādam.

# The 22nd Chinmaya Mahāsamādhi Ārādhanā Day









Chinmaya Ārādhanā day was observed with a Pādukā pūjā by members of CMSD with great śraddhā. All were dressed in traditional kerala style.

San Diego is a very important place for CM devotees worldwide as our beloved Pujya Gurudev left his *Jyoti* here twenty two years ago on Aug 3, 1993 at 5.45 PM.

The Chinmaya Jyoti lamp was lit at 5:45 PM, the exact time of *Pujya Gurudev's Mahāsamādhi* in San Diego 22 years ago. Following this, 108 *jyoti-s* with Gurudev's OM signature were lit by the *sevikā-s* dressed in Kerala sarees and it was a very profound experience. The *Guru Pādukā pūjā* was performed with the chanting of the *aṣtottara nāmāvali*. The celebration culminated with a sumptuous *mahā prasādam*, prepared by all the *sevikā-s*.

# Chinmaya Blossoms Preschool opens at Chinmaya Jyoti





### CMSD Samskrta Vihar Classes - Certificates by CIF

With the blessings of Pujya Guruji, Swami Advayananda and Swami Ramakrishnananda of <u>Chinmaya International Foundation (CIF)</u>, CMSD became the first campus in the US to start a certificate program in Sanskrit language (Samskrta Vihar) for children (grades 4-12) and adults. The program was blessed by Swami Ramakrishnananda on Sept. 5- Śri Kṛṣṇa Janmāstami.

CMSD currently has 35 students enrolled in this program including nine Bala Vihar children and two CHYK-s.

### Satsanga with veteran Gandhian Dr. S.N Subbarao





We also had a very Special *satsanga* with veteran Gandhian Dr. S.N Subba Rao on July 26<sup>th</sup>.Dr. S.N. Subba Rao, a fellow of Gandhi Peace Foundation and founder of National Youth Project. He inspires and lifts up the spirit of youth in the world for building a new society based on Love, Peace, Harmony and Social Justice. Every one affectionately calls him 'Bhai Ji,' meaning 'Elder Brother' and he reciprocates their love with equal abandon.

Sukumarji introduced Dr. Subbarao to the people gathered. He said that he and Lakshmi have been associated with Dr. Subbarao since the early 90's through the Gandhi camps that he conducted in the Bay Area, which Maya Sukumar used to attend. Subbaraoji has visited San Diego a few years back. Sukumarji welcomed him to our midst again and appreciated him taking time out to visit us.

Dr. Subbarao gave a talk on how he got started following Mahatma Gandhi's principles when was in his teens with the "Quit India" movement and since India's independence has been involved in youth projects through out the world. He talked about his involvement with the decoits of Chambal Valley in Madhya Pradesh in the 70's. Through love and devotion expressed in his songs and talks, the robbers who plundering anyone who came their way, laid down their arms and surrendered to the Govt. of India. Since then they have been rehabilitated and are leading normal lives.

By popular request, Dr. Subbarao gave a wonderful rendition of "Bharat Ke Santan", a song that he sings in more than a dozen Indian languages. He also led the group into some simple games such as "How many, how many ..." in which several children and adults participated enthusiastically.

The evening came to a conclusion with a wonderful dinner prepared lovingly by our member families. Everyone wished that Subbaraoji would come back soon and be amongst us.

# CMSD 12th annual Youth Camp - "The Game of Life"

This summer, Bala Vihar campers had a unique opportunity to learn how spirituality



plays an
important part in
"the game of
life." Using

children were

shown how something as simple as a board game can help us understand how to play the real game of life. The game of Cricket played a central role in making *dharma* more understandable.

This year, summer camp was from July 13<sup>th</sup> to July 25<sup>th</sup>. Lakshmiji taught children grades 3 and above and Hema Pandya taught the lower grades. They were well assisted by Padma Bhat, Smita Bhatia, Faith Prasad, Sujata Kulkarni and Swaroopa Kalva.

Every morning, the children started with prayers, followed by performing *Guru-Pādukā Pūjā* in handmade rangoli plates with clay *Pādukā*. Campers were also guided through each step of Guru *Pādukā Pūjā* and the significance of each of the 16 steps. Several campers were also able to memorize the 108 names of Pujya Gurudev.

After the children ate breakfast, learning time began in the courtyard. Before lunch, there was yoga followed by the chanting of Chapter 15 of the *Bhagavad Gītā*. In the afternoon, the children did art projects and played many different types of games including Chess, Chutes and Ladders, Mancala, and Parcheesi. There was even a day dedicated to Cricket. All the children came on Saturday morning and played a Cricket match along with many parents. The children also enjoyed games like OM! Alone and Wheel of Virtues. They learned *Toṭakāṣṭakaṁ*, Chinmaya Balavihar song and the 'He Muralī Śrīdhara' bhajan. Every day they were given homework to memorize twelve names of Gurudev from the śrī Chinmaya Asṭottara Nāmāvali.

Each activity was filled with learning opportunities and connected with the main theme. For instance, during learning time, the discussion topic was the concept that 'only when the mind is quiet, can we connect with Nature and to God'. After that, the children would walk around the Ashram quietly observing the surroundings. Another special moment was when the children were playing

a made-up game. In this game, Lakshmiji had a basket of objects and each child was called up and shown an object. Then the child had to speak for one minute without hesitating ('um' or 'ah'). They learned that when their thoughts



are clear their speech would also be precise.


The menu for the children was also specially planned and prepared. Great care and love was given in selecting menu items and ingredients. One day the children actually prepared their own lunch. This was very special for them and they enjoyed the experience.


During the final program the children performed *Guru-Pādukā Pūjā* using their hand-decorated plates. The children were meticulous in their chanting. They presented the various bhajans they had learnt during the camp and also presented the values they had learnt from every day objects.

When the children narrated the various Indian games they played during the camp they were bubbling with joy. Oh, what a wonderful and nostalgic list: Cricket, Koko, Wheel of Virtues, Parcheesi, Chess, Carrom, Paramapadam etc. They presented the various lessons they learnt from these games and how to apply them in their everyday life. The cricket game played in the Chinmaya Juoti parking lot the previous week was the highlight for both children and parents who attended. Last but not the least, the children relived their favorite dish from the wide variety of healthy Indian dishes they had savored during the two weeks in the camp."
